Program Sponsorship

- Shop/Salon Owners
- Apprentices are W2/W4 employees
- Paid by the hour, no less than Minimum Wage - Full time
- No fees due from apprentices
- Required Wage Increases
- Must follow Required Ratio of Apprentice to Licensed Barber/Cosmetologist
- 2000 hours OJL + 250 hours RTI
